Flowers



The daffodils survived the winter and put on an early display, followed by the other bulbs. The daffodil bulbs are being dried out and will be replanted in the autumn. The trees on the pier and other shrubs have been pruned.

Finding summer bedding plants was something of a challenge, but our head gardener, Cathy Galbraith, succeeded in the end. Planting includes red, pink and white busy lizzies, white and blue trailing lobelias, yellow and pink begonias, antirrhinums and fuchsias – so we expect a colourful display. Pink and red geraniums have been planted in the tubs on the pier. Sweet peas, clematis, honeysuckle and jasmine are being grown in our plot at the south end of the car park.

Welcome Back!

An indication that life is getting back towards a semblance of normality is the return of the Royal Scotsman luxury train to Wemyss Bay. During the summer the train normally visits Wemyss Bay on Sunday afternoon every two or three weeks. It is part of a Friday afternoon to Monday morning tour from Edinburgh, taking in sights on the West Highland Line and Mount Stuart. The level of service provided is indicated by the fare from £4,550.
