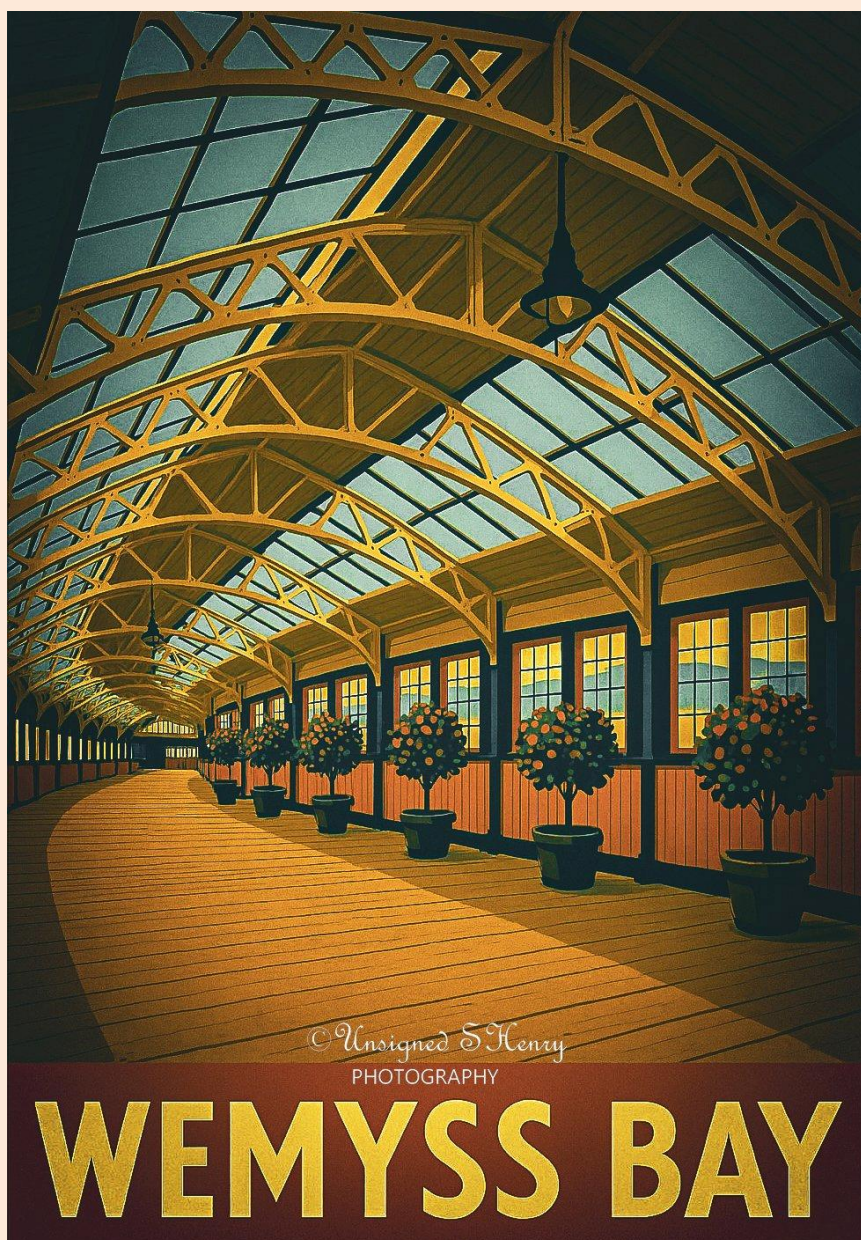

was incorporated on 16 January 2025, allowing us to enter into a formal lease of the bookshop, as required by ScotRail. Negotiations over the terms of the lease are still under way. Arrangements will essentially be unchanged, but on a more formal basis. All supporters of Friends of Wemyss Bay Station are now members of the Company. A Community Interest Company is one which operates to provide a benefit to the community it serves and not for private profit. The Directors of the Company are previous Committee members Greg Beecroft, Brenda Campbell, Elizabeth Campbell, Simon Dell, Cathy Galbraith, Sue Hothersall, Sheena Inglis and Agnes McAuley. 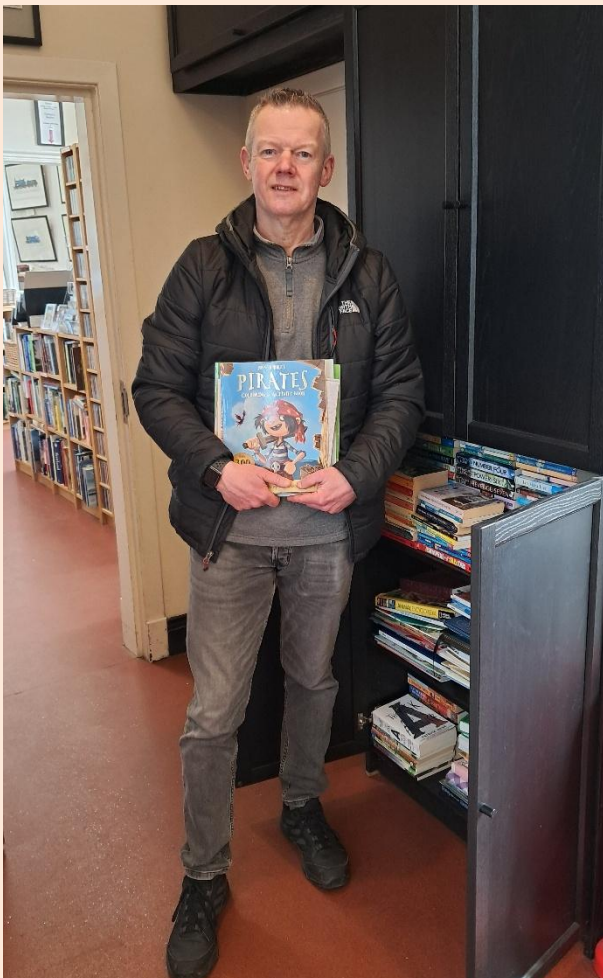

Several local artists and crafts people will be displaying their work.

GCHS run five caravans at Wemyss Bay Holiday Park for disadvantaged children and young people who rarely, if ever, get the chance of a holiday. The Friends, in partnership with GCHS, provide books and DVDs for the caravans, to boost literacy and provide enjoyment during the children's stay.

We have also provided funds to Wemyss Bay Primary School and Skelmorlie Primary School for the purchase of books.
